
JAPAN-ASEAN GDP



ASEAN-JAPAN POPULATION






ASEAN-JAPAN AGING RATE




JAPAN INDUSTRIAL TRANSITION

Japanese Leading Industry Shift





AVERAGE MONTHLY WAGE IN JAPAN





AVERAGE MONTHLY WAGE IN THE WORLD








WHY DEI IS IMPORTANT FOR INNOVATION?





ENERGY CONSUMPTION GROWTH RATE



ENERGY CONSUMPTION PER CAPITA




JAPAN-ASEAN INDUSTLIAL STRUCTURE 2019
