





The Thai Auto-Parts Manufacturers Association (TAPMA)

- Thai automotive industry is structured in pyramid
 - with car makers on top and auto parts makers in
 - lower layers by deliveries.
- 27 motor vehicle makers and 18 motorcycle makers.
 - Over 90% of which are owned by multinationals.
- 525 suppliers in 1st tier. About 65% of which are majority owned by foreigners.
- **1,760** suppliers in 2nd & lower tiers. About 70% of which are Thai owned.

Jan – Sep 2023 = 1,221,878 Units Jan – Sep 2024 = 1,005,749 Units


Production volume 2023-2024


Thailand Production Performance (Thousands Units)








Thailand Car Performance


Export Sales by Brand



Export Sale by Region




Export Sale by Country


